

Bolivian Visa Information-

Entry requirements: You will need to present the below 8 things to immigration on arrival. They should be color copies and you will NOT get them back. Visas last for 10 years.

- Color copy of valid U.S. passport with at least 6 months validity remaining.
 - Copy of Yellow Fever Vaccination card.
 - Copy of bank statement showing you have funds to return. (Cross out account numbers)
 - Copy of a return-trip ticket back to the USA.
 - 1- 2"x2" passport headshot passport photo in color
 - Copy of lodging in Bolivia, such as a hotel reservation. (Liz will provide this.)
 - Pay \$160- credit card (but can require cash so bring both)
 - Must complete the web-based registration process (SIGEMIG) prior to arriving in Bolivia. **Print and sign a copy to bring with you.**

- If arriving passengers have not completed the electronic registration prior to arriving in Bolivia, immigration inspectors at the port of entry will register them and instruct them to update their registration information as appropriate. The registration must include lodging information for the registrant. **THIS WILL DELAY YOUR ENTRY SIGNIFICANTLY-** do it prior to arrival. **You will not be allowed entry if you do not have ALL of the above items ready to hand to them.**

Notes:

- With a visitor visa, you may stay 30 days per trip, not to exceed 90 days per year. A Bolivian visitor visa costs \$160 US and can be paid in U.S. or local currency upon arrival.
- Make sure you get entry and exit stamps from the Bolivian authorities every time you enter or leave Bolivia.
- If you received the Bolivian visa at a land border or at an entry port and you lose your passport, you will need to get a new visa and pay the visa fee – \$160 US – in order to leave the country.
